Based on the book by David Lucas, with music composed by Raph Clarkson, Key Stage 1 pupils enjoyed learning and singing original songs to participate in the concert along with musicians from Britten Sinfonia and the dynamic presenter, Sheena Masson.

The Feedback has been 100% positive and we are delighted that we have been able to bring this project to Peterborough schools.

Following the tour, Sheena, along with Britten Sinfonia and the composer returned to two schools to deliver a set of creative workshops. Children were involved in creating new music which they then performed in a special concert with Britten Sinfonia musicians to parents and carers.

This training is **FREE** and generously supported by Arts Council England.

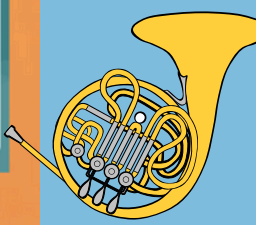

Action for Schools

THE DFE HAVE UPDATED GUIDANCE ON PUBLISHING A SUMMARY OF YOUR SCHOOL MUSIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN

All schools should have a music development plan, as set out in the National Plan for Music Education.

The DfE are asking schools to publish a summary of their music development plan on their website before the start of the 2024 to 2025 academic year. Schools should then update the summary before the start of each new academic year.

Publishing a summary will help schools to:

- raise awareness of their music development plan
- promote the school music offer to parents and prospective parents
- give greater opportunity for schools and music hubs to work together

Assistance is available via the Music Hub in relation to the school music education development plan.

Peterborough Music Hub have self-assessment tools to support schools. Please contact morag.richardson@peterborough.gov.uk and I will be happy to send out the documents to you. Please state whether you require primary, secondary or SEND.

Completion will enable the Hub to provide support to schools for the creation of the plan and any summary publication.

This year, Peterborough Music Hub partnered with Conductive Music to deliver STEAM sessions to sixteen Peterborough Primary Schools.

Creative Conductive Music Session Stokes Curiosity!

Years 2 and 3 at Hampton Lakes were living their best musician and scientist lives recently! They had Ms Yui come into their classes to teach them all about using technology to make music. They used circuits, online pianos and different electrical conductors to explore how electricity can be used to create tunes. They used graphite pencils to allow paper - and even plastic rulers - to complete a circuit and control their online piano. Both year groups were even able to use each other - touching hands and even foreheads to complete circuits! WOW! One Year 2 described what they saw as 'like magic!'

MTML and CME COURSES

TRAINING COURSES TAILORED FOR CLASSROOM TEACHERS, TEACHING ASSISTANTS, AND COMMUNITY MUSICIANS ENGAGED IN SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTS. ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS FROM PETERBOROUGH MAY HAVE ACCESS TO FUNDED PLACES.

Moving Towards Music Leadership (MTML)

This is an intensive 3-day training course for teachers, teacher trainees, teaching assistants and community musicians who work in primary schools. Applicants would be expected to have some musical skill and demonstrate an interest in becoming a music subject leader or undertaking a refresh of the role. The three seminars will be arranged to avoid clashes with work commitments:

A place on this programme will incur a £200 fee, to include all materials.
